Echoes of Nature: Hampshire County is a collaboration between poet Kim Hoff and musician Jess Martin, inspired by the forests, rivers, and conservation lands of Western Massachusetts. Through poems, songs, and performances, the project invites audiences to listen deeply to nature and to one another—fostering connection and environmental stewardship.





BEYOND THE VALLEY

What began in Hampshire County has grown into a model for how the arts help communities reflect on their relationship to the land.

With support from Local Cultural Council grants in Amherst, Belchertown, Easthampton, and Williamsburg, Echoes of Nature has brought performances to libraries, senior centers, galleries, community centers, and outdoor spaces.

Collaborations with local poets, including town laureates, show how the project adapts to different voices and settings.
